The BIG READ is Back!

Coming this March-May, the annual **Big Read** program begins its fifth year. The featured book for 2009 will be announced in December. The official program guide for all ten participating libraries will be available in the Westmont Library in February. Register early for **Big Read** programs as seats fill quickly!

Children's programs this spring will be similar to the **Big Read** theme and will provide education and entertainment for all ages.

Remodeling Continues at WPL

Since June of 2007, the physical changes in and around the Westmont Public Library have been substantial. We began with a re-designed lobby area that features an often used coffee and tea bar, display cabinets, and new planter boxes.

The Youth Services Department went through a major updating that included adding a children's reading garden, opening up the Storytime Room for more frequent use, shifting the juvenile fiction and non-fiction areas, and adding modern furniture to the teen section. The

former help desk has been moved and resized to make more space for shelving and open study areas.

The next phase focuses on the adult area of the library. The former adult help desk was taken out and replaced with a smaller desk closer to the entrance.

In the coming year, you can expect to see the finishing touches put on our second floor remodel before embarking on changes to the first floor adult area.



Up on the Roof

Many of you witnessed roofers recreating a rain storm over our building this summer and fall.

They did this to determine why so much rain water is finding its way into the Children's Library. The key finding is that the roof needs to be replaced before the metal decking, which protects much of the library's collections, furnishing and equipment, is damaged beyond repair.

The Library Board is exploring all options for a long-term, environmentally friendly and cost effective solution. For such a

large roof, it will not be cheap to tear off the old tiles, battens and insulation and replace it. All of this must be done while protecting patrons, staff, collections, and equipment.

The library board honored the voter's request of limiting the library's taxing rate to 19 mils. This means the library will seek a bond or loan that will be paid back over 10-15 years, depending on the ultimate cost of the project. We estimate the average homeowner will see an increase of \$9 in their

tax bill as the library has not been collecting the full amount approved by voters in 2005.

With library use and visits up more than 20 percent this last year, it is hoped that the new roof project can be accomplished without significant cuts to the increasingly popular library collections, programs and services.
